# **REMINDERS FROM THE OFFICE:**

# ALL SALES APPLICATIONS BY NEW OWNERS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A <u>\$100 APPLICATION FEE</u>. ALL <u>NEW LEASES</u> MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A <u>\$100 APPLICATION FEE & A \$100 ADMINISGTRATIVE FEE</u>. ALL <u>LEASE RENEWALS</u> MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A <u>\$100 ADMINISTRATIVE FEE</u>.

If you are planning to have renovations done in your apartment, you must consult with the Office as to the procedures you must follow. Failure to do this may put you at risk.

Please be advised that if you lock yourself out of your apartment, you will not be able to procure a key from our Management Team or a member of the Board of Directors. Possible solutions include giving a key to a neighbor, replacing your door handle key lock with an electrical key lock which has an access code, mounting on the outside of your door a small coded box similar to those used by realtors (you can place a copy of your existing key inside and enter your code to get your spare key).

PLEASE NOTE THAT IT NO LONGER NECESSARY TO SEPARATE RECYCLING ITEMS. PAPERS, PLASTIC, GLASS, CARDBOARD MAY BE PLACED IN ANY RECYCLING BIN. Please use bins & dumpsters assigned to your building, and advise contractors employed by you to do the same. No furniture, bathroom fixtures, matresses, cabinets, etc. are to be put into the dumpsters.

Owners of second & third floor units are asked to have commercial rug cleaners put protective covering on the walkway railings to prevent scratching by the hoses.

REMINDER: shoes may not be left on the deck or steps to the beach as they create a safety hazard.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE MANAGER'S OFFICE IS OPEN FROM 9 A.M. - 1 P.M. MON. - FRI.

Please turn off your water & water heater before leaving on even a short trip. You are advised to turn off the valve a few times before leaving to ensure that it is not leaking. Air conditioners should be professionally serviced twice a year to reduce the likelihood of leaks. Please keep records of servicing.

Rules require the wearing of coverups while en route to the pool or beach. Towels are required on poolside chairs for all in bathing suits. A shower must be taken before each & every dip in the pool. Diving & the use of flotation devices are prohibited. Non-swimmers who wish to cool their feet in the pool should first rinse them under the shower.

Citrus rinds, banana or onion skins or large amounts of any matter should NOT be put into your garbage disposal unit. Please run plenty of water during, and after using your disposal.

All owners are required to LEAVE COPIES OF THEIR APARTMENT KEYS IN THE OFFICE. SAFEGUARDS HAVE BEEN ESTABLISHED TO ENSURE THEIR SAFETY. Your keys will be secure in the new lockbox. Only three people have a key to the room wherein the lockbox is located, & to the lockbox itself. A leak in an unoccupied unit for which there is no key available, is a problem not only for the owner, but for neighbors. IF YOU HAVE CHANGED YOUR LOCKS, PLEASE BE CERTAIN THAT A CURRENT KEY HAS BEEN BROUGHT TO THE OFFICE.

Smoking is no longer permitted on the clubhouse porch or in the fenced in areas around the pool & shuffleboard courts. A patio, with a table, chairs & ashtrays, has been installed as a smoking zone outside the fenced in area.

The Board of Directors asks that the residents do not trim any of the landscaping in the community. Should you feel that trimming is necessary, kindly contact the Property Manager Ty Stambaugh.

FOOD AND BEVERAGES ARE <u>NOT</u> PERMITTED AROUND THE POOL <u>EXCEPT</u> AT FUNCTIONS SPONSORED BY THE SOCIAL COMMITTEE. GLASS IS NEVER PERMITTED IN THE POOL AREA.

The Board of Directors reminds would-be gardeners that there can be **no planters or other flower containers along the** walkways. Walkways are common areas and must remain clear for safety reasons and for EM responders with their equipment. Please, door mats only.

PLEASE: DO NOT PLACE MOTHBALLS AROUND THE INTERIOR OF YOUR UNIT. THEY ARE POISONOUS AND THE SCENT SEEPS INTO OTHER UNITS!!!!

SO CALLED "FLUSHABLE WIPES" DO NOT READILY DISSOLVE, AND <u>ARE NOT COMPATIBLE WITH OUR</u> <u>PLUMBING SYSTEM. PLEASE FLUSH ONLY TOILET PAPER TO AVOID SERIOUS PLUMBING PROBLEMS.</u>
